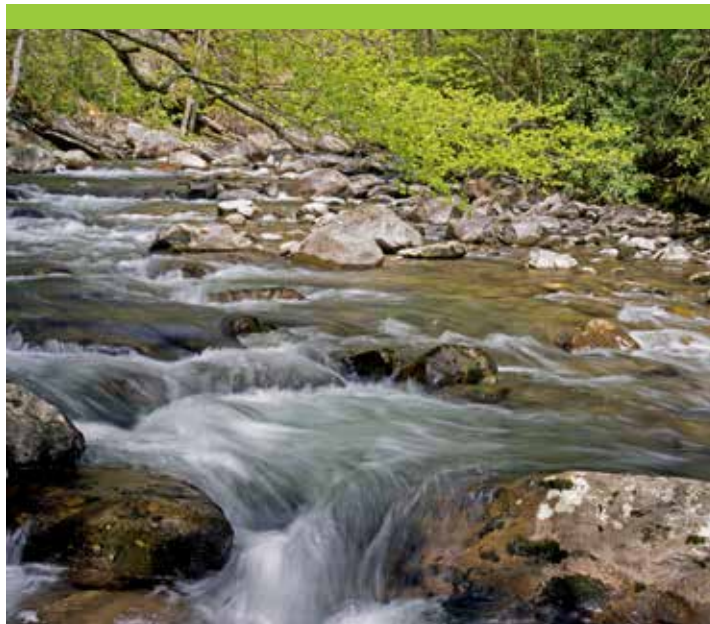

A \$16.7 million water treatment facility in Hummelstown was brought online in 2006. It utilizes innovative technology to process water far more quickly than conventional water treatment. In 2016, a new water treatment facility opened in Bloomsburg. This leading-edge facility represents SUEZ' largest investment since we began operating in the state. Today, SUEZ owns and operates four water utilities in eight counties across central Pennsylvania, serving 166,000 people.

Innovative membrane filtration technology is utilized at the Bloomsburg and Hummelstown facilities. SUEZ' global research and development and worldwide operations and maintenance (O&M) experience made it all possible. Both facilities were built above the floodplain to assure continuous operation during times of future flooding, and both provide water service at a high rate to several of SUEZ' largest customers in Pennsylvania including Autoneum, Bloomsburg University and Fresh Express.
